

D7. Street Lighting Service - Rules

DEFINITIONS

Governmental authorities are defined as any tax supported body or one of its instrumentalities.

PAYMENT OF BILLS

Payment for service shall be made monthly at the rate of one-twelfth of the annual charge, and monthly bills shall be due and payable not later than the due date shown on each bill.

SERVICE RULES

1. Ownership

a. Overhead System

- 1) The company shall own, operate, and maintain the entire street lighting system, including circuits and lighting fixtures.
- 2) The company will be responsible for all future group replacement of ornamental systems. The decision to replace ornamental equipment will be at the sole discretion of the company and will take into consideration good utility operating practice and the desires of the governmental authority.
- 3) Upon request and at the expense of the governmental authority, the company will relocate or change the position of any lamp.

b. Ornamental System (Customer owned)

- 1) The governmental authority shall own the system, including switching equipment and the connecting cable to the company's system.
- 2) Systems must be of a design and in a condition satisfactory to the company.
- 3) Replacement of governmental authority owned equipment shall be at the expense of the governmental authority.
- 4) The system may be served by either multiple or series type circuits as agreed upon between the customer and the company.

2. All lights will be turned on at approximately fifteen minutes after sunset and off at approximately thirty minutes before sunrise.

3. The company will replace burned out lamps (excluding LED) promptly and will keep the fixtures clean and in good operating condition.

4. In case of lamp outages continuing more than one complete night, payment to the company may be reduced by one-thirtieth of the monthly rate for each full night of outage (excluding LED).

<p>5. Individual locations with vandalism records will be reported to the customer, and the customer is given the option of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Continuing service with the provision that future replacements due to continued vandalism at that location will be at the customer's expense, b. Continuing service but at a different location, or, c. Discontinuing service at that location. 																			
<p>6. Replacement of existing company-owned mercury vapor street light fixtures shall be subject to a plant lost payment by the customer to compensate the company for fixtures rendered useless. Agreement to such payment shall be in writing prior to installation of the new facilities.</p>																			
<p>7. The mounting height of company-owned facilities shall be in accordance with company standards. Customer-owned facilities shall not be mounted in excess of 40 feet without written company approval.</p>																			
<p>8. Upon request of the customer, the company will temporarily disconnect service to any fixture. Upon reconnection, the customer shall be subject to a reconnection charge as specified in the company's filed rules. While service is disconnected, the charges of this rate shall be reduced by the following amounts:</p>

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9. Maintenance of Customer Owned Ornamental Systems

a) The following items are considered normal maintenance of customer owned ornamental street lighting and will be replaced or maintained at company expense:

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1) Lamps (excludes LED): Group replacements, premature burnouts, and burnouts due to excessive vibration from vehicular traffic or wind.

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2) Refractors (excludes LED): Breakage from thermal shock due to excessive heat from dirty glassware, water hitting hot glass and wind damage.

3) Underground and/or overhead cables: All breaks or open circuits except those caused by accidents, improper installation, foreign digging operations or deterioration due to aging and/or absorption of moisture. Deterioration due to aging is to be determined by the company.

EXTENSION OF SERVICE1. Company Owned Standard or Ornamental System

Street lighting facilities will be extended upon request by the proper authorities, subject to the provisions of the Company's electric extension rules.

2. Customer Owned Ornamental System

Additional lights will be served at any location designated under the same rates, terms, and conditions, provided the additional units are not more expensive for the company to operate and maintain.

SHORT TERM SERVICE HOLIDAY/DECORATIVE LIGHTING

Subject to Company approval, the Company will allow municipal customers to make temporary attachments of holiday lighting and/or decorations on Company-owned light poles. The customers must execute an annual agreement for such attachments, and must meet all conditions thereof. Estimated energy consumptions will be billed under the current Cg-1M energy rate. Time and material charges for installation, removal or associated maintenance may also apply.

TERM OF CONTRACT

Minimum period of three years subject to automatic renewal periods of one year each. The contract may be terminated at the end of any yearly period upon 90 days' written notice by either party.

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
