<p><u>EFFECTIVE IN AVAILABILITY</u> All territory served. This schedule is available only to those customers taking service on this schedule as of 4/15/66, and billed at the same location under this schedule continuously since that date.</p> <p><u>FACILITIES AND DELIVERY OF SERVICE</u> All electric service for the trailer park and its tenants will be delivered by the Company at one point through a master meter installed at that point to measure the total amount of service taken.</p> <p>The lines, cables, and equipment necessary to distribute electric service from the point of delivery by the Company to the individual trailer stalls or locations on the premises of the trailer park shall be furnished, owned, and maintained by the trailer park operator. Such distribution system shall be designed and constructed in such manner as to meet the requirements of the Wisconsin State Electrical Code and of any local lawful regulations which may apply. No change in the ownership or physical nature of the distribution facilities existing in any trailer park as of 5/1/59, shall be required as a result of this rule. The distribution system will be so operated and maintained by the operator as to cause no interference with service to other customers of the Company.</p> <p>The trailer park operator will assume all responsibility for the electric energy after it leaves the Company's point of delivery, as well as for his own wires, cables, and equipment beyond the point of delivery by the Company. The Company shall not be responsible for injury or damage to persons or property occasioned by the distribution of such electric energy or by such wires, cables, or equipment beyond the point of delivery, except where such injury or damage is caused by negligence of the Company.</p> <p><u>MONTHLY RATE</u> The trailer park operator may exercise one of three options for assessing the cost of electric service against the occupants of the individual trailers: <u>Option 1</u> The operator may treat electric service as an incident to tenancy and include it in the rent for trailer space without specific charge therefor.</p>

Option 2

The operator may install his own meter at each trailer stall and submeter and bill electric service to the tenant at a rate no higher than the Company's standard rate for residential electric service effective in the territory in which the trailer park is located.

Option 3

The Company will install a meter in a socket to be provided by the trailer park operator at each trailer stall designated by the operator. The Company will read the meters and render monthly bills in the name of the trailer park operator for each stall. Such bills will be calculated at the Company's standard residential rate effective in the territory in which the trailer park is located. The payment of the bills will be the responsibility of the operator. Such bills may be tendered by the operator to the tenant of the trailer stall for payment, but the Company will assume no responsibility for the collection of the bill from the tenant. Where there is no registration on a meter during the month, the fixed charge of the rate will apply. Resumption of service at an individual trailer stall after prior disconnection at the request of the operator shall be subject to the Company's filed reconnection charge.

Where the occupant of a trailer stall vacates the stall between readings of the Company's meter, the operator may read the Company's meter and bill the departing tenant for the use of electric service since the last reading of the meter by the Company at a rate no higher than the Company's standard rate for residential electric service effective in the territory in which the trailer park is located.

When the operator of a trailer park chooses Option 1 or Option 2, the entire use of the trailer park as registered on the Company's master meter at the point of delivery shall be billed to the operator at the appropriate standard rate for small commercial and industrial service or for large commercial and industrial service, depending on load size, effective in the territory in which the trailer park is located.

When the operator of a trailer park chooses Option 3, the summation of the consumptions determined from the readings of the Company's meters at the individual trailer stalls will be deducted from the consumption registered on the Company's master meter at the point of delivery to the trailer park. The difference between these two values, representing the electric requirements of the trailer park for the office, service building, yard lights, water pumping, unmetered trailer stalls, or other general uses, will be billed to the operator at the appropriate standard rate for small commercial and industrial service or for large commercial and industrial service, depending on load size, effective in the territory in which the trailer park is located.

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
