### Candy Bar Ice Cream Pie

Servings: 6-8  
Prep time: 30 minutes  
Freeze Time: 15 minutes + 1 hour

- 1 cup chocolate syrup, divided
- 2 cups Rice Krispies cereal
- ¼ cup sour cream
- 1 quart caramel toffee ice cream, softened

Coat bottom and sides of an 8-inch pie plate with butter or non-stick spray. Add ¾ cup of the chocolate syrup to the cereal in a bowl and mix. Press mixture over the bottom and up the sides of the pie plate. Freeze for about 15 minutes or until firm. Combine remaining chocolate syrup and the sour cream in a bowl and mix. Spread the ice cream over the firm cereal in the pie plate. Drizzle with the sour cream mixture. Cover and freeze about an hour.



Keeping your freezer set between 0-5 degrees F is the best way to keep food frozen while saving energy. Any lower and you're wasting energy. Test yours with a thermometer today!

## HELP for WI customers

During Wisconsin's hot, humid summers, air conditioning sends the need for electricity soaring — and that can result in demand outpacing supply and higher rates. By participating in the **HELP Energy Conservation Program**, however, you can help yourself and the environment.

With **HELP**, WPS turns off or cycles (on and off) your central air conditioner during periods of high demand. This helps WPS meet demand without building new power plants, which contributes to more stable energy prices and is better for the environment, too. As a reward for your commitment, you'll receive an \$8 per month credit on your bill from June through September (\$32 total).

**HELP** is simple. A small remote-control switch is connected to your central air conditioning unit. When electrical demand approaches peak levels, WPS turns off the power or cycles your air conditioning on and off for a limited time period. You'll never be affected more than 8 hours per day, 10 to 20 days per year.
