

Breakfast Pizza

Baking temperature: 375 degrees

Baking time: 20-30 minutes

- 1 lb. pork sausage
- 1 pg. (8 oz.) refrigerated crescent roll dough
- 1 ½ cups frozen loose-packed hash browns
- 1 cup Cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1 cup Swiss cheese, shredded
- 5 eggs
- ¼ cup milk
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Fry pork sausage, drain and set aside. Unroll crescent rolls and separate. Place on a 12-inch pizza pan with points toward the center. Press together on the bottom and sides of the pan, sealing perforations to form a crust. Layer fried sausage, hash browns, Cheddar cheese and Swiss cheese over crescent roll dough. Beat eggs, milk, salt and pepper. Pour egg mixture over sausage, hash browns and cheeses. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese, then bake.

Add any other favorite toppings, such as mushrooms, green peppers, onions, etc. before eggs.

Energy Saving
TIP

Energy-saving tip: Turn off your oven several minutes before the Breakfast Pizza's full cooking time has finished. It will retain enough heat to cook the pizza thoroughly and you'll save energy.

Conservation still a smart move

- If you are purchasing new natural gas equipment or appliances, look for the ENERGY STAR® label.

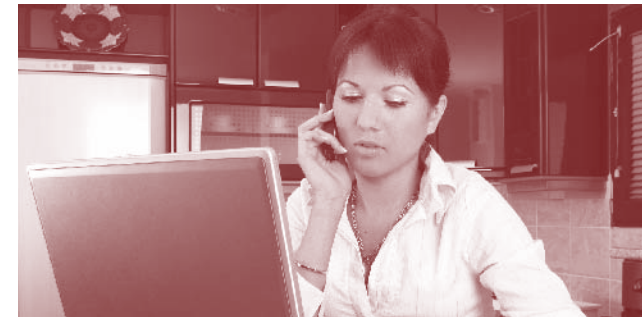
